# Chancellor's Affordable Housing Task Force April 23, 2018 Chair's Update

## Working Assumptions Undergirding the Work of the Task Force:

- There is a real and very urgent affordable housing crisis that is having major impacts on UC Davis students. We intend to document this with data in our final report/recommendations.
- Our understanding of our charge is to identify potential actions the campus and/or others might take to pursue effective solutions to this crisis.
  - o These can include both short-term and longer-term ideas.
  - They can include steps the campus can take directly as well as actions that might require the cooperation of the city or other entities in the region or state.
  - o They can include both incremental shifts in existing policies and programs and/or more innovative and fundamental changes in how we do business.
- In the relatively short time we have for our work, we hope to hear from as many individuals or groups as possible who have constructive ideas related to our charge.
- We will do our best to meet the June 30 deadline for our report to the Chancellor.

#### **Task Force Activities**

The following activities have occurred since the task force was charged on February 9, 2018:

- The task force chair, David Campbell, met individually with each task force member to solicit
  perspectives on the issues and our task force work. This included meeting with both the
  outgoing and incoming ASUCD Presidents.
- An initial task force meeting was held March 8. At this meeting we introduced ourselves to
  one another, brainstormed on the topic of "what is the right question" to be asking about
  affordable housing, and made plans for regular meetings during Spring quarter. The chair
  shared a list of individuals who had either contacted him or been contacted by him for
  information.
- We secured funding from the Chancellor's office to hire a spring quarter GSR to support the data and information gathering needs of the task force. Rob Saper was hired.
- A second task force meeting was held on April 3. At this meeting we invited Bob Segar, Assistant Vice Chancellor, Campus Planning and Environmental Stewardship, and Matt Dulcich, Manager, Government and Community Relations to have a conversation with the task force about the university's long range development plan and related issues impacting housing affordability. Task force members engaged in an extensive period of Q&A with our guests. Following their visit the task force brainstormed ideas for types of data we need to support our work.
- A third task force meeting was held on April 17. At this meeting we invited task force member
  Emily Galindo and two staff from Student Housing and Dining Services to a conversation about
  housing operations, service provision, design, and financing. Mike Sheehan, Director of
  Facilities Services, and Branden Petitt, Director of Student Development shared information

with the task force. Subsequent to that conversation, we heard from member Jeanelle Hope about plans to have the task force meet with the Graduate Student Association at one of its coffee/bagel/doughnut days. Also, GSR Rob Saper shared preliminary work resulting from his data gathering and analysis efforts.

• The chair and other task force members attended the Affordable Student Housing public forum hosted by the Davis Vanguard at Davis Community Church on Wednesday, April 18.

### **Upcoming events**

- We plan to meet once a week for the remainder of Spring Quarter.
- On April 24 chair Campbell will meet with Professor Steve Wheeler's LDA class to discuss the
  committee charge, prior to their initiating work on affordable housing as part of their class
  assignments. On May 15 the class will present findings and task force members are invited.
- At our April 24 meeting Associate Professor Jonathan London from the Department of Human Ecology and students from his fall class will present the work the class did on affordable housing issues.
- At our May 1 meeting, Chancellor Gary May and Karl Engelbach are scheduled to meet with the Task Force.
- On May 21 the task force is invited to have a conversation with the Davis Social Services Commission at their regular monthly meeting.
- As we get later in the quarter, the task force will spend less time hearing from others and more time working to develop a consensus on key recommendations.
